GOOD CARE PROLONGS THE LIFE OF THE UPHOLSTERY

Vacuuming is an essential part of the basic furniture care, just like laundering is the basic care for clothes.

Vacuum gently and often enough. By doing so you avoid the sticking of dirt and dust on the fabric. Remove loose dirt lightly with the textile nozzle of your vacuum cleaner.

Do not rub the fabric with the wrong nozzle as this will wear out the fabric and destroy its weaves.

VACUUM – DO NOT BEAT

Do not beat the upholstery of the furniture. Beating damages its weaves. Regular vacuuming is sufficient to remove the dust.

AVOID MOISTURE

Protect the fabric from moisture and damp/moist objects as they may leave stains and impressions on the fabric.

Impressions may appear on pile fabrics as the moist upright pile threads bend under pressure.

REMOVE STAINS IMMEDIATELY

Remove the stain immediately. Don't let it stick.

A fresh stain can usually be removed from synthetic fabrics with a mere moist cloth.

When removing stains from natural fabrics, cleaning or stain removal agents may have to be used in addition to the moist cloth. They should be tested first on a hidden area.

Tips for stain removal

- Act quickly in order to limit the size of the stained area. Remove the stain by working from the edges towards the centre to avoid further damage.
- Remove loose dirt carefully with a knife or a spoon, then dry immediately with a clean cloth. Observe the instructions above.
- Local stain removal can be done by carefully drying the stain with a sponge or an absorbent tissue.
- Always rinse out the stain removal product with care.
- Avoid hard friction, do not damage the surface.
